

ONEC Sculling Steps Necessary to Take Out ONEC Club Boats

A. Authorization to take out recreational boats and racing doubles

1. Learn-to-Scull Participants

- There will be a sculling competency assessment at the end of LTS Step 2. If you pass, and you register as a member you will be given permission to take out recreational single, doubles, and quads as well as racing/sport doubles.

2. New members who are experienced scullers

- New members must undertake an Orientation and Assessment (registration form is under Rowing Resources).

B. Authorization to take out high performance (racing) boats

1. New members, and returning members without authorization to take out high performance boats

- Take a Step 3 course which is free for members. At the end of this course, there will be a sculling competency assessment.

C. Clinics

- Under the supervision of a coach and usually with the escort of a coach boat, high performance boats can be rowed by members not yet having authorization to use these boats.

D. Guests

- All registered rowers in good standing with a FISA rowing club are allowed to row as guests up to 3 times if they are accompanied by an experienced ONEC sculling member. Non-rowing ONEC members can row recreational boats up to 3 times if accompanied by an experienced ONEC sculling member.

E. Junior Youth Members (Participants)

- Youth family members (under 16 years of age) may row a club boat under adult or coach supervision only.

Scullers will be sent an e-mail giving them boat reservation permission within a few days of passing a sculling competency assessment. Only then can they reserve and take out club boats.
